NOTICE OF PUBLIC INPUT HEARINGS**

**2025-2029 CONSOLIDATED PLAN AND 2025 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN**

The North Dakota Department of Commerce Division of Community Services (NDDCS) and North Dakota Housing Finance Agency (NDHFA) are in the process of preparing the state's 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan and the 2025 Annual Action Plan. The Consolidated Plan is the state's five-year strategic plan to prioritize federal funding for the state's HUD-funded programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME), Housing Trust Fund (HTF), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG).

As part of the citizen participation process, the state will hold two public input hearings to gather input on and to prioritize North Dakota's needs for affordable and special needs housing, services for individuals who are homeless, public facilities, and economic development assistance.

The FY2025 Annual Action Plan (AAP) will outline how the state will allocate the 2025 annual allocations for CDBG, HOME, HTF and ESG, and prioritize which activities will be funded.

Communities, organizations, and citizens are encouraged to comment, either in writing or during the hearing, to help the state identify and prioritize needs to create opportunities that are in the best interest of North Dakota citizens. The comments received will be used in the development of both the Consolidated Plan and the AAP.

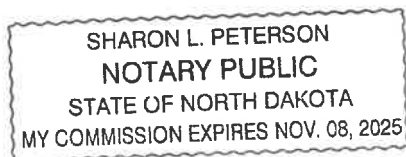

Dear ND Housing Finance Agency,

I am writing to advocate for the prioritization of and investment in homeless prevention resources in North Dakota. It is important that we recognize homeless prevention as an irreplaceable component of an effective response system.

In 2024, Presentation Partners in Housing, in partnership with the CARES Homeless Prevention Project and FirstLink (2-1-1), handled 3,537 total housing crisis calls which resulted in 2,295 unique Housing Crisis Triage Assessments. These numbers represent Cass County, ND households only. Compared to 2023, this is a 35% increase in call volume. This increase occurring as pandemic era funds disappear is very worrisome.

Homeless prevention is essential not only for reducing rates of homelessness, but also for breaking the cycle that leads people back into homelessness. To have an impact, we must focus on the inflow of people into homelessness, which can be decreased with targeted interventions such as rental assistance, mediation, legal aid, and case management. Without these resources, more people will continue to fall through the cracks, only to find themselves facing the devastating consequences of losing their homes.

In 2024 in Cass County, 373 (16%) households seeking services through the CARES Homeless Prevention Project were experiencing homelessness at the time of the initial engagement. 1,647 (72%) households seeking services had received either a 3-Day Eviction Notice or a Court Summons for Eviction. The remaining 12% of households were seeking assistance with late rent or utility bills but had not received an eviction notice yet or were looking for assistance relocating to new housing. If local organizations do not have the upstream resources to respond at critical stages of a housing crisis, especially in a timely way, there will be an uptick of households entering homelessness. The current system is not equipped to manage the rates of homelessness it is already experiencing. By preventing evictions, we can reduce the burden on emergency shelters, while also enhancing the stability and well-being of individuals and families.

I urge the prioritization of homeless prevention funding so local organizations can better serve those on the verge of losing their homes and stop homelessness before it starts. Thank you for your consideration and for your ongoing work to address homelessness in North Dakota.

The City of Almont has a tremendous amount of sanitary sewer and water system infrastructure needs including the following:

- 15 blocks of water mains, services, hydrants and valves estimated to cost \$2.0 M
- A leaking water storage reservoir estimated to cost \$500,000
- A sanitary sewer lift station estimated to cost \$500,000
- 12 blocks of sanitary sewer mains estimated to cost \$2.0 M

We are trying to acquire funding for these projects, but are struggling to do so. Although small grants are helpful for some, we are in need substantial grant funding in order to complete the work. Due to mobilization costs, we cannot complete the work in small projects (1-2 block projects) and the best value for our community is to complete larger projects where fixed costs can be spread out over bigger areas.

We would like to see the HUD program funding be available for Community Development Block Grants for public infrastructure.

I have had a few case workers/organizations coming to me for guidance as it relates to denials because landlords are not applying the voucher when calculating the applicants rent to income ratio. ND protects individuals receiving financial assistance and NDHFA requires landlords (financed with NDHFA programs) to not deny households based on having a voucher... however, it seems like the way around this is by not taking the financial assistance into consideration while qualifying residents.

I'm not sure how often this is occurring in the market, but Chandler was the 4<sup>th</sup> individual that I've heard explain this scenario.

The North Dakota Coalition for Homeless Persons respectfully provides this letter for consideration when prioritizing Federal funding to meet North Dakota's needs, specifically for affordable and special needs housing as well as services for individuals who are homeless.

As a nonprofit organization with members of diverse agencies from both urban and rural areas, we are acutely aware that each community in North Dakota faces unique challenges when it comes to affordable housing. We know that addressing housing instability and homelessness requires a coordinated entry system with appropriate responses to each household's situation, whether it be providing homeless prevention assistance, emergency shelter, or rapid rehousing. Furthermore, it is NDCHP's official position that we **do not** support a parallel system of assistance for housing and homelessness related issues being built in the Economic Assistance Division at the Department of Health & Human Services that runs against evidence-based and nationally recognized best practices for homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing. The funding administered by the ND Rent Help Housing Stabilization program is not effective at providing homeless prevention assistance throughout the state in a timely manner. Our membership strongly agrees that any programming and financial resources to address homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing are best facilitated through NDHFA and the ND Continuum of Care's coordinated entry process so existing community-based organizations can continue to deliver on these essential services. With this in mind, we recommend prioritizing all three ESG activities – homelessness prevention, emergency shelter, and rapid rehousing – to support the trusted local organizations already doing this work in communities across the state.

The City of Steele faces an aging infrastructure as it relates to our water and sewer utilities and streets. Much of these utilities have been in place since the 1940's and are in serious need of replacement.

Improvements in the past have been hindered by a lack of funding. We are a low-income community with a limited economic base. We now face an increasing number of system failures which are costly and are a huge burden on the resources that we do have. We are putting what resources we have into Band-Aid measures. We realize that the logical approach is for large scale replacements to be made but there is no way that we can afford to do so. Recently we have been working with Moore Engineering to conduct a study of our needs and priorities for improvements moving forward (USDA search grant).

Based on the needs assessment we intend to seek funding for the following:

\*Southwest Utility and Street Improvements- Phase 1 - \$8,000,000

\*Southwest Utility and Street Improvements- Phase 2 - \$5,000,000


\*Southeast Utility and Street Improvements- Phase 3 - \$10,000,000

\*Northside Utility and Street Improvements- Phase 4 - \$10,000,000

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Good morning. This email is in response to the request for comments on the pending public hearings and future decision on fair housing in ND.

We have a mixed-use development in downtown Williston, with half of the residential as HIF units. We have owned and operated low-income housing tax credit/mixed-income for more than three decades and have experienced multiple jurisdictions of fair housing administration.

In our opinion, the affirmative furtherance of fair housing choice is unnecessary, is an additional cost to the state and adds to the bureaucratic infrastructure. When searching for a new apartment (or when comparing prices in response to a renewal offer), all prospective and current tenants have access, via the internet, to all necessary information on pricing, features, availability, etc. It is the very rare landlord that is not using the internet via multiple property platforms to promote rentals. In addition, with online reviews, everyone is able to — and many do -- express their favorable/unfavorable opinions online regarding anything about their housing. This can be a positive or a negative for landlords, and it definitely provides feedback for landlords to take action to improve their service and/or product.

The fair housing act has been in place since 1968, and it's long past time for government to acknowledge that the need for this type of legislation is past. There is most certainly no need to emphasize what everyone in the country already knows. Let us use our tax dollars for something that better serves the population of North Dakota.

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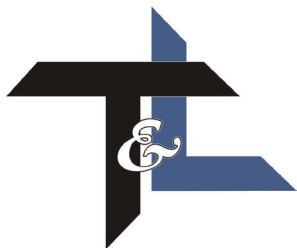

The comments received will be used in the development of both the Consolidated Plan and the AAP. Franchuk recognizes Natalie Wandler for 20 years of service to the county.

Lee presented the October 2024 Sheriff report to the Commission: • Total calls for service 1583 – down from 1604 last year • Traffic stops 119 – down from 188 last year • 7 theft-related calls – down from 8 last year • 346 PR stops – down from 351 last year • 13 calls for K-9 • 61 Traffic Citations Issued • 14 24/7 Violations • Transports: 13 Prisoner, 12 Court, 0 Juvenile, 3 Medical, 4 MH • Responded to 19 accidents: 0 pedestrians, 0 fatality, 1 hit & run, 2 injury, and 16 property • 84 Total Arrests and 63 Warrants served • Civil Division: 244 attempts / 52 Subpoenas / 145 Civil Papers / 7 Criminal Papers.

Lee addresses the body found by Belfield, details will come as they are available and there is no danger to the public. The Sheriff's Department provided election help with several walk-throughs for early voting and had people at 5 locations on election day. Multiple Halloween events were attended.

Lee introduced and administered the Oath to the following new deputies: Chandler Wanner and Roselynn White. Both deputies and Franchuk sign those Oaths after administration.

Eldon Mehrer requests out-of-state travel for the drug task force officer narcotics task force training in California, November 21-27. Mehrer is looking for approval to send the officer, there is no cost to send him, except for his salary as the task force is covering the conference and travel.

Heiser asks for the commission to approve the RFP for the Box Culvert by South Heart. KLJ was awarded the RFP after scoring and a resolution needs to be signed.

To authorize the Chair to sign the resolution. All voted aye, motion carried.

Heiser all road employees are out blading, and water tankers are running with them. Fischer is actively crushing on the Heinle pit and testing the gravel, the reject finds are ground with scoria and it makes good material.

Heiser presents information that Bobby Kubas provided him regarding road work that was done by a neighbor, and he doesn't want to be liable for this work that was done as he wasn't involved. This is a section line by 125 th by Belfield. Heiser states that it was not approved to county standards and there is a section line policy. Heiser believes it should be seeded back to grass, and he has discussed this with Engelstad. Engelstad says our policy is that improvements need to be to county standards. Heiser will reach out to Ryan and see if he will plan grass and put a few straw wattles in.

Heiser comments they have been renting a track hoe and have put out for bids on a used machine to purchase. The bids will be opened on the 21 st . Commissioner Messer and White will attend the RFP opening.

Andrews Krebs, KLJ, updates on the roundabout they are to finalize the ROW limits and will continue working on the environmental documents. The Hwy 10 Chip and Seal has been completed and has been submitted to the DOT.

James Kadrmas, Interstate Engineering, 130 th Ave. bridge removal, and they are working with the state to see if a low water crossing can be put in.

Andrew Schank, Highlands Engineering, 83 rd Ave project is completed, within 1% of the project budget. Discussion on the low water crossing was put on hold due to lack of funding, the state has slated \$1.2 million for those projects and \$60,000 to remove the bridges, so they are seeing if they will fund the low water crossing as there is funding out there.

Northern Plains - not present at the meeting.

Pat Kuylen, South Heart Fire District, there was a miscommunication, and he forgot about turning in the budget report, so it was turned in late. Richard advises a preliminary budget needs to be turned in for the estimated statements, if not turned in, then the previous year's amount is used on the estimated statements. If a final budget is then turned in you will get the previous year's amount that was set and the deadline for the final budget is October 10. If you don't turn in either, then you can't charge tax mills for your entity. Richard advises that South Heart Fire also gets state aid from Stark County. Kuylen is asking for \$50,000 for operations for 2025. They do currently have a balance, as they are saving for a Tanker Water Truck, they are hoping to purchase it at the beginning of 2025. Messer suggests funding something toward the equipment and having them use their savings for operating.

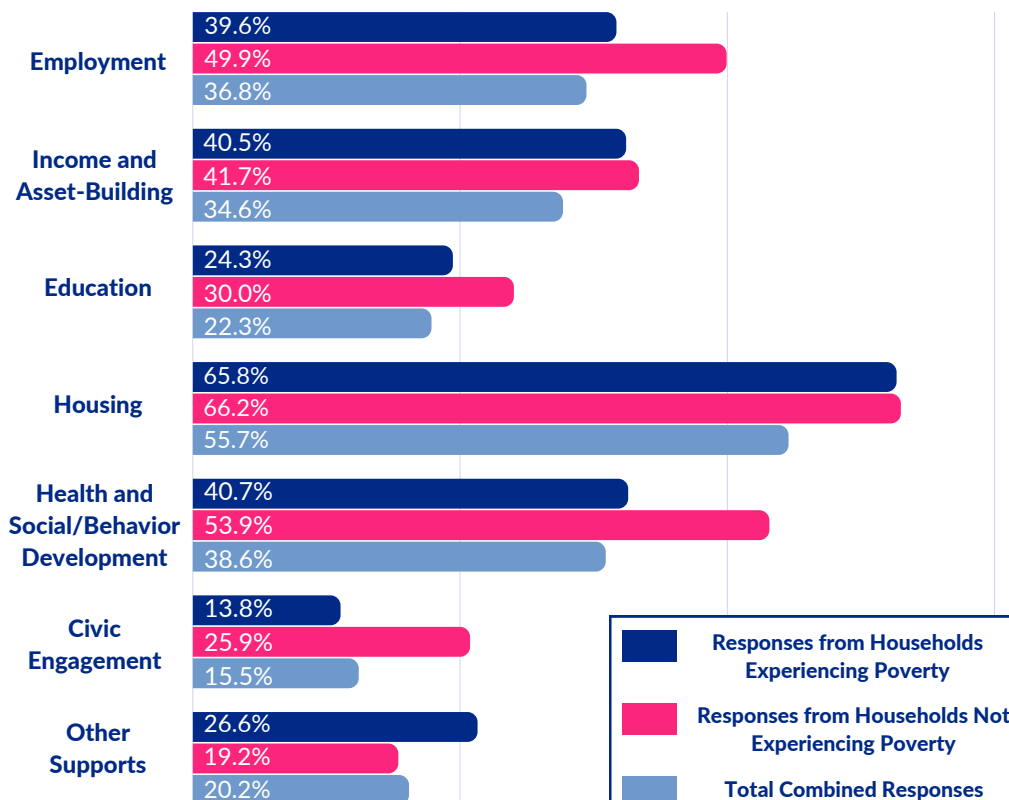

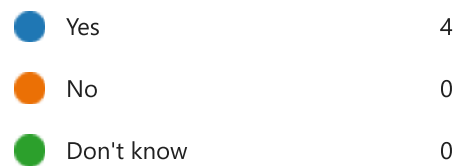

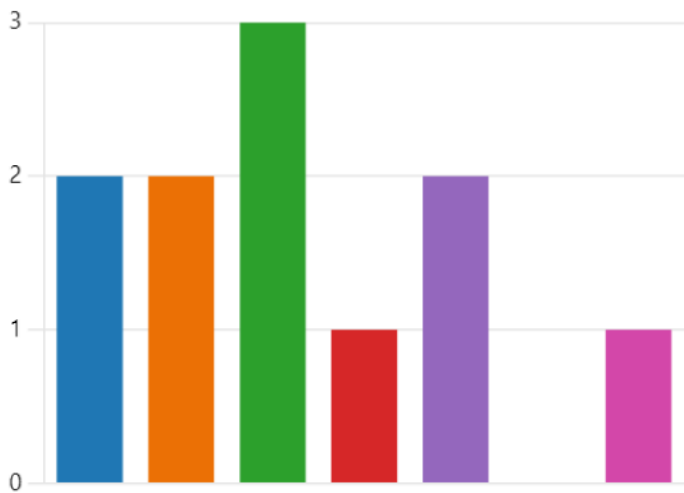

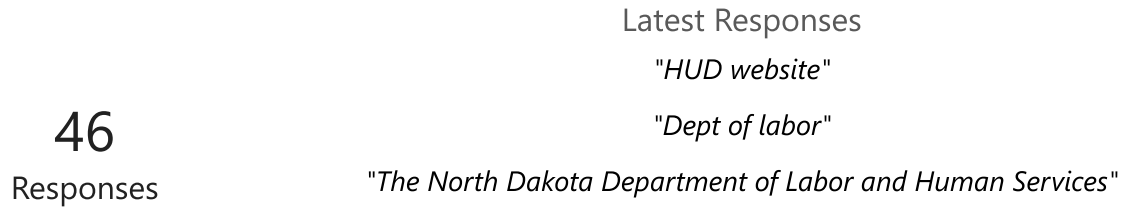

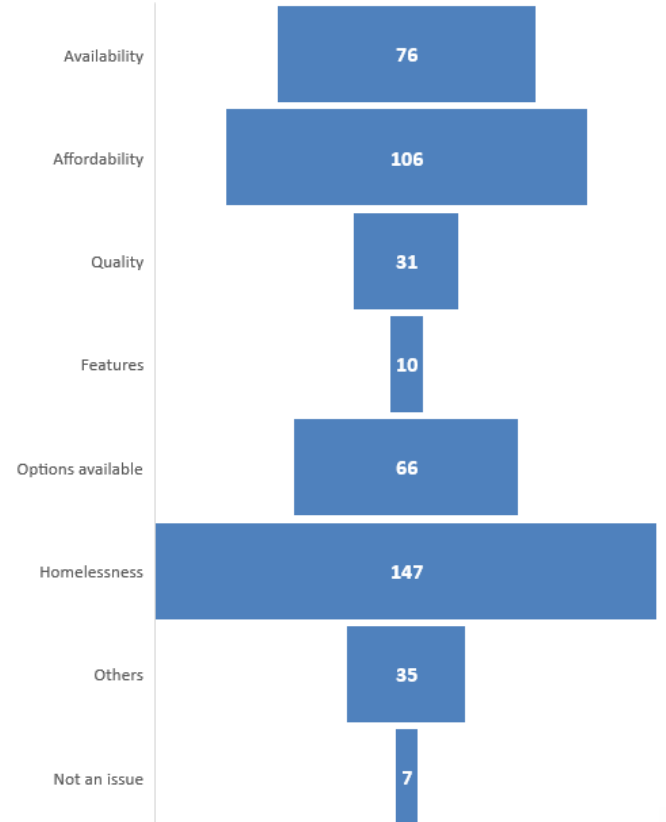

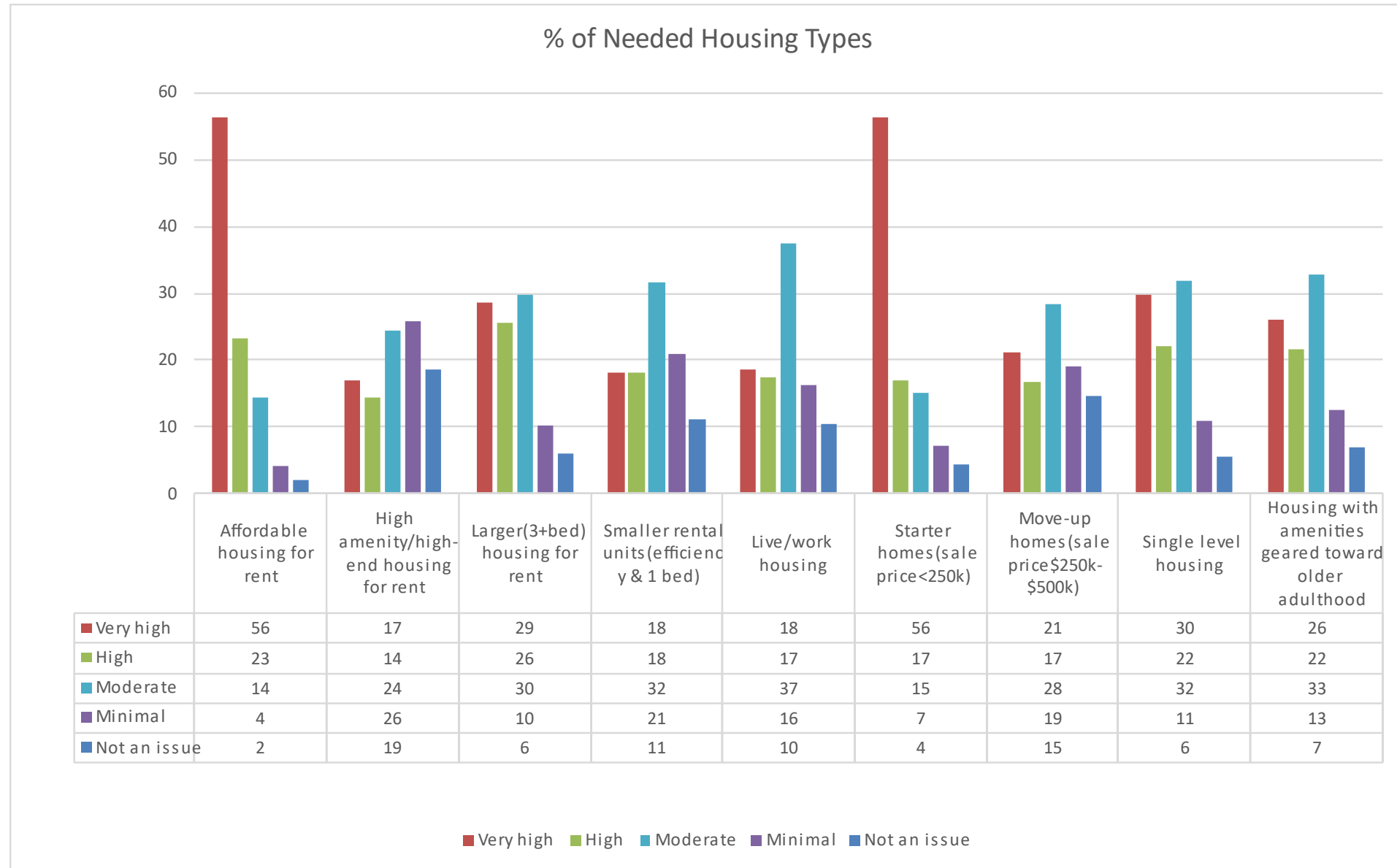

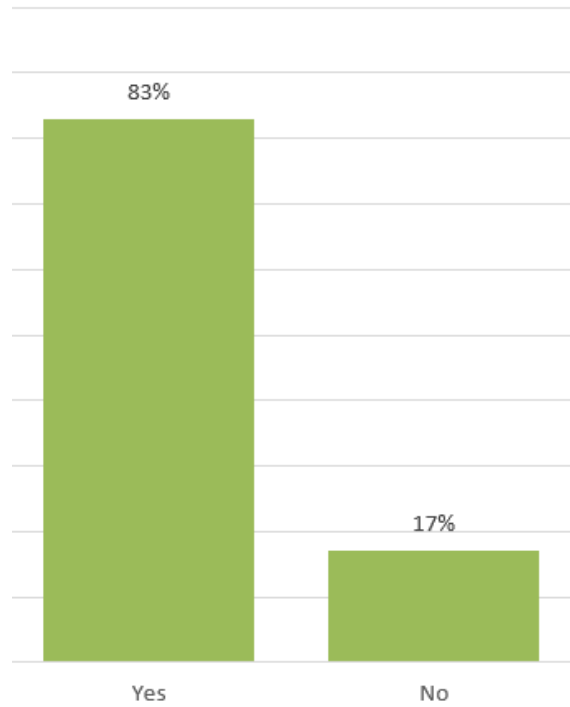
**Q:** In your experience, what **specific types** of housing are **most needed** in your area?



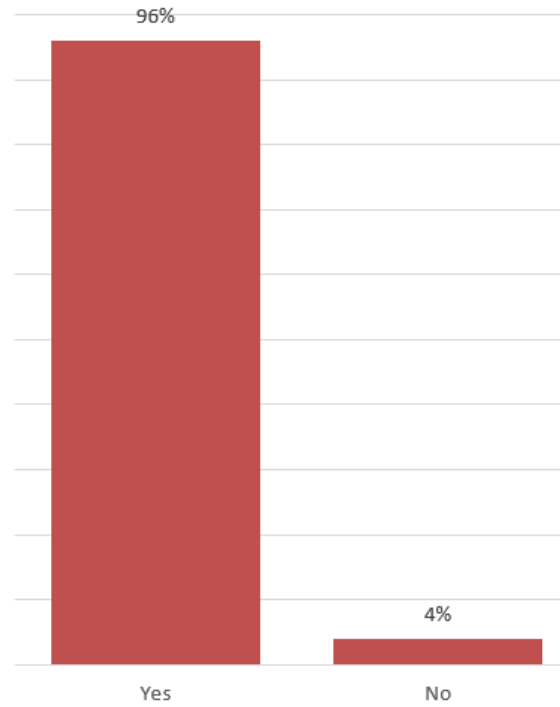

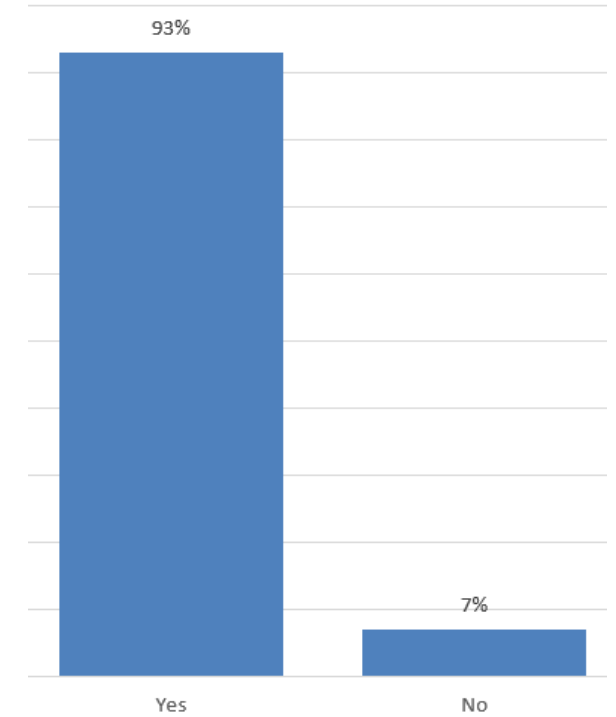

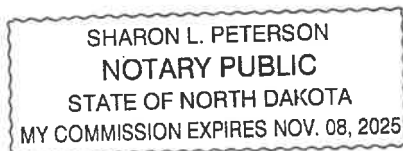

# Woman drowned her dog at Florida airport

ORLANDO, Fla. — A woman drowned her dog in a Florida airport bathroom and then boarded her international flight after she was prevented from bringing the white miniature schnauzer with her because of a paperwork issue, authorities said. The woman was arrested Wednesday in Lake County on a charge of aggravated animal abuse, a third-degree felony. She was released on \$5,000 bail.

“This act was intentional and resulted in a cruel and unnecessary death of the animal,” an arrest affidavit from the Orlando Police Department said.

Online court records showed no attorney listed for the woman from Kenner, Louisiana.

The investigation into the death of the 9-year-old schnauzer named Tywinn started in December, when a janitor found the dog in a trash bag in a bathroom stall at Orlando International Airport.

The janitor earlier saw the woman in the stall cleaning up water and dog food from the floor. The janitor was pulled away for a cleanup emergency and returned to the bathroom 20 minutes later, where she found Tywinn in the trash container along with a companion vest, collar, rabies tag, a dog travel bag and a bone-shaped dog tag with the woman’s name and phone number, investigators said.

Airport surveillance cameras captured the woman speaking for 15 minutes to a Latam Airlines agent with the dog in tow, walking into a bathroom near the ticketing area with the dog and exiting the bathroom without Tywinn less than 20 minutes later. The woman then went outside the terminal building, reentered a short time later, passed through security and boarded the Colombia-bound plane, the report said.

Authorities said the woman was told she could not bring her dog aboard because she did not have the

proper paperwork. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, dogs traveling from the U.S. to Colombia must be accompanied by a veterinarian-issued health certificate and a rabies vaccination certificate.

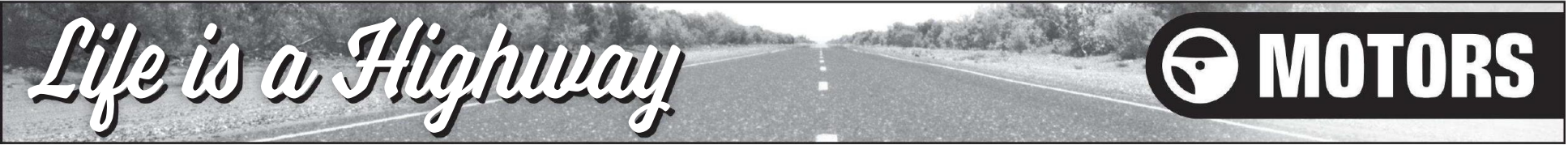

"If Question 2 passes and Question 1 fails, only the additional one percent sales tax language will be adopted; the cap language would be removed before adoption."

Hatting added, "Bottom line, without a positive vote of the people

on Question 2, there would not be a sales tax increase."

**ORDINANCE NO. 1157**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WILLISTON AMENDING THE FOLLOWING PARTS OF CHAPTER 3 OF THE WILLISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES: AMENDING ARTICLE III, SECTION 3-37 OF THE OF WILLISTON CODE ORDINANCES REMOVING LANGUAGE THAT RESTRICTS OFF SALE TO "WINE PRODUCED BY THAT WINERY" SECTION 3-37(B) (21) REPLACING IT WITH BROADER LANGUAGE PERMITTING OFF-SALE - A DOMESTIC WINERY LICENSE. WHEREAS, Section 40-05-01(29) of the North Dakota Century Code grants municipal political subdivisions the power to regulate the use of alcoholic beverages subject to the provisions contained in title 5 of the North Dakota Century Code, and WHEREAS, the City of Williston has adopted ordinances governing the regulation, sale, and licensing of alcoholic beverages subject to the provisions contained in title 5 of the North Dakota Century Code; and WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City of Williston to amend its ordinance governing alcohol licenses; and WHEREAS, the proposed ordinance amendment grant allow domestic winery licensees to sell any legally permissible wine, whether produced by that winery or by another winery; and WHEREAS, by adopting this amendment, the City expects to have a minimal effect on existing

off-sale license holders, as domestic winery licenses are highly specialized, subject to the production and licensing requirements of both state law and the Williston Code of Ordinances. Because of these specific requirements, it is unlikely that many such licenses will be issued within the City of Williston. Consequently, any impact on the broader off-sale market within the City should be negligible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF WILLISTON, NORTH DAKOTA THAT:

Chapter 3, Article III, Section 3-37(b)(21) by removing language that restricts off-sale to "wine produced by that winery" and replacing it with broader language permitting off-sale

of any wine legally allowed under North Dakota law, which shall now read as follows:

A "domestic winery license" authorizes the licensee to operate a domestic winery and to produce and sell wine on-sale and off-sale, whether produced by that winery or by another winery, within the City in accordance with the requirements and limitations of N.D.C.C. § 5-01-17, which are incorporated herein by reference. A domestic winery licensee is also subject to the following restrictions and conditions:

(c) A domestic winery license authorizes the licensee to sell wine, whether produced by that winery or by another winery, at on-sale or off-sale, in retail lots, and not for resale, and may sell or direct ship its wine to persons inside or outside the State in a manner consistent with the laws of the place of the sale or delivery in total quantities not to exceed 25,000 gallons in a calendar year. In addition, a domestic winery licensee may, if so authorized by a license issued by the State of North Dakota, sell beer on-sale only, provided that such on-sale beer sales shall be incidental to the sale of wine..

The intent of this amendment is to expand a domestic winery licensee's authority to off-sell all legally permissible wine, rather than only the wine produced by the licensee within the City of Williston. While domestic winery licensees remain subject to North Dakota Century Code requirements (N.D.C.C. § 5-01-17) governing production, distribution, and sampling, this amendment allows broader off-sale privileges that supplement (rather than conflict with) state law provisions.

If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage and approval, as provided by law.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on March 11, 2025, after its final passage, approval, and publication.

**FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT TO ALL INTERESTED GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES AND PUBLIC GROUPS:**

As required by guidelines for the preparation of environmental impact statements, an environmental review has been performed on the proposed action below:

Project: East Williston & County Road 9 Rural Distribution Western Area Water Supply Authority (WAWSA) and Northwest Regional Water District (NWRWD)  
Location: Williams County, North Dakota  
DWSRF Project No.: 5301686-02  
Total Cost: \$12,073,575

The proposed project is for the installation of additional rural water pipe to connect new users to the existing drinking water distribution system. The purpose of these improvements is to provide potable drinking water to residents in the rural water service area. This project will ensure that WAWSA and NWRWD can continue to serve existing and new residents in Williams County. The WAWSA has obtained a Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan to finance the project. The rural water district has the legal authority and financial and administrative capability to construct the proposed improvements.

This project is located in northwestern North Dakota and will install approximately 73 miles of rural water pipe in Williams County. For a further discussion of this see Item VI, Environmental Impacts of Proposed Project in the attached Environmental Assessment document. Wetlands, area flood plains, threatened or endangered species habitat, or archeological sites will not be adversely impacted. The US Fish and Wildlife has determined that the

project may affect piping plover. The project will avoid construction within one-half mile of the Little Muddy River during the breeding season of April 15 to August 15.

The North Dakota Game and Fish requested that the Little Muddy River be crossed by directional boring, and if that is not feasible, construction should not take place within the waterway between April 15 and June 1, and controls should be implemented to minimize erosion and sedimentation.

The North Dakota State Historic Preservation Office (ND SHPO) has concurred with the "No Adverse Effect" determination for the proposed project area (ND SHPO Ref: 24-0101) provided sites 32W189, 32W1940, 32W1950, 32W1286, 32W12087, 32W11235, 32W12084, 32W1949 and 32W1939 are avoided as described in the accepted Class III Cultural Resource Inventory report and the project takes place in the location and manner described in the documentation and all borrow comes from an approved source. The review process did not indicate significant environmental impacts would result from the proposed action. Consequently, a preliminary decision not to prepare an environmental impact statement has been made. This action is taken on the basis of a careful review of the engineering report, environmental information document, and other supporting data which are on file in the Municipal Facilities Division of the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality.

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY RESTRAINING PROVISION Under Rule 8.4 of the *North Dakota Rules of Court*, upon service of this Summons, you, and the other parent, are bound by the restraints following: (1) Neither spouse may dispose of, sell, encumber, or otherwise dissipate any of the parties' assets, except: (A) For necessities of life or for the necessary generation of income or preservation of assets; or (B) For retaining counsel to carry on or to contest the proceeding; If a spouse disposes of, sells, encumbers, or otherwise dissipates assets during the interim period, that spouse shall provide to the other spouse an accounting within 30 days. (2) Neither spouse may harass the other spouse. (3) All currently available insurance coverage must be maintained and continued without change in coverage or beneficiary designation. (4) Except for temporary periods, neither spouse may remove any of their minor children from North Dakota without the written consent of the other spouse or order of the court.
